Architectural Drawing Exercise 1

Assignment Due: **Monday, August 29, 2005**

Intent: The purpose of this exercise is to develop your "seeing" skills and your ability to correctly draw gathered information. This is critical to the student's understanding of the environment around them.

Assignment:

1. Using a wood encased pencil, a technical pencil, a technical pen (or disposable pigment liner) and a medium felt pen, draw a series of 1" hatching squares. Required number of hatches for each instrument is six (6). Do not draw the border around the square.
2. Using a wood encased pencil, a technical pencil, a technical pen (or disposable pigment liner) and a medium felt pen, draw a found object. The object should be fairly complex with differing textures. Divide the object in four (4) and use a different instrument in each section.
3. Items #1 and #2 must be drawn on one (1) 11" x 17" vellum.
4. Choose a view looking down the street in front of the BCC 33 campus building (on the south side). Draw the streetscape including building and major elements. Do not draw every detail, but edit information to communicate spatial relationships. Draw the line or edge that separates form and space. This must be drawn on one (1) 11" x 17" vellum. Use your desired drawing instrument.
